





"Giuseppe Sormani" International Prize for works on Antonio Gramsci Fifth edition

Regulation

Fondazione Istituto Piemontese Gramsci announces the fifth edition of the Sormani Prize dedicated to **Antonio Gramsci**. This edition and the next ones will see an alternation of orientations so conceived: one time the studies dedicated to Gramsci will be privileged, the next one the choice will fall on studies testifying the fortune of Gramsci in the current developments of every discipline or cultural sector.

- 1. The competition is open to printed works published from November 2017 to July 2020 onwards and to unpublished ones on the theme of the *crisis* in the work of Antonio Gramsci. There are two possible declinations of the theme: a) the crisis in general (economic, social, political, institutional, cultural) or a specific historical crisis with a significant reference to Gramsci's ideas on the subject; b) the crisis as the object of a literary, musical or cinematographic work that takes up or develops ideas that can be traced back to Gramsci's thought.
- 2. Candidates are asked to send a printed copy, if available, and an electronic copy of the work (volume or essay, or score, or film) to Fondazione Istituto Piemontese A. Gramsci, Via del Carmine, 14, 10122 Turin (Italy), by 30 September 2020 with the indication 'Premio Sormani' in the subject and on the envelope or parcel, as well as the complete address with telephone and e-mail and, apart from that, a short curriculum vitae. The same data and the electronic copy must be communicated by e-mail to premiosormani@gramscitorino.it.
- 3. If the work is in a language other than Italian, French, English, Portuguese, Spanish and German, the candidate is also required to send his work translated to one of these languages.
- 4. The jury may award up to two prizes, one of which is for the work of a young beginner. If the winner is only one, he will be entitled to the full amount of 3,000 euros. If there are two winners, 2,000 euros will go to the newcomer in support of the publication.
- 5. The Award will be assigned at a public ceremony that will take place in Turin in January 2021. The winners participation expenses will be paid by the Foundation.
